

- Extrinsic


The Nature of Motivation

Achievement Motivation Theory

•Need for Achievement - desire to take on tasks and accomplish them satisfactorily •Need for Affiliation - desire of individuals to belong to a social group and to participate with others and create friendships Need for Power individuals are comfortable in executive positions where they can make decisions in highly competitive situations

Achievement Motivation Theory


Characteristics of Higher Achievers

- 1. Like situations where they take personal responsibility for finding solutions to problems
- 2. Moderate risk-takers rather than high risk-takers
- 3. Want concrete feedback on their performance
- 4. Tend to be loners

Ways to Develop High Achievers

- 1. Obtain feedback on performance
- 2. Emulate people who have been successful achievers
- 3. Develop an internal desire for success and challenge
- 4. Daydream in positive terms by picturing oneself as successful
