

Management

- Sand pit floor or bedding
- Assisted lifting with slings
- → Turn side by side every three hours
- Wound care
- Monitor udder daily for mastitis
- Fomentations
- → Apply oil (Muruvu oil, Tmk oil)



Treatment

- **→** Calcium borogluconate
- Phosphorus supplementation oral or IV
- → Electrolyte supplementation- RL iv
- Analgesics-NSAID, Steroids
- Vit E and Selenium im
- → B1,B12,B6 im or epidural










Manual lifting of recumbent animal
